After servicing the North Toledo Corridor Area neighborhood for more than 85 years, the Friendly Center (<u>http://www.friendly-center.org</u>) received a makeover Saturday, October 15, courtesy of Toledo-area Chrysler Group employees.

Friendly Center, in partnership with the United Methodist Church Global Board of Ministries, is an agency of social concern committed to the development of its neighborhood and its people. The Center provides programs and services that include emergency/food/hygiene products, after-school and summer enrichment programs, adult education classes, senior fellowship and recreation to a neighborhood of more than 12,000 people from mixed-ethnic backgrounds.

"Chrysler Group's relationship to Toledo is very important," said Mauro Pino, Plant Manager – Toledo Assembly Complex. "Everyone, from the local government and business community to the outstanding residents of this city, is incredibly supportive of our operation here. In return, we believe that it is our duty to use our skills and resources to reinvest in our community and help our neighbors."

Earlier this year in January, employees commemorated the life and legacy of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with a week of community service activities throughout SE Michigan.

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
