- Scored second-place finish in most recent NCWTS start at Charlotte (race No. 5) equaling his career-best finish in the series.
- Has finished third or better in his two most recent starts.
- All three top-five finishes in the series have come on speedways (one- to two-mile tracks).
- Average finish of 10.7 in three starts in the series this year.

#### RAM DRIVER QUOTES

"Kentucky is one of the few racetracks we go to that's really, really bumpy. It's probably the bumpiest oval that we go to. That just adds a whole new element to the ways that it affects our RAM and the ways you set up your truck. It puts a huge emphasis on myself and the team to find the right shock package and spring package for 'ride quality' over the bumps. Kentucky is a little bit flatter than most mile-and-halves that that we go to. All those things combined make it a very unique situation. That puts the emphasis on personnel and not on the equipment. We, as a team, can make things happen."

#### KENTUCKY SPEEDWAY NUMBERS

- RAM has two previous wins at Kentucky Speedway: Scott Riggs (2001) and Bobby Hamilton (2004).
- RAM has one pole at Kentucky: Jason Leffler (2002).
- Five RAM drivers finished inside the top 10 in the 2004 race.
- RAM drivers finished 1-2 in the 2001 race (Joe Ruttman finished second behind race winner Scott Riggs).

#### RAM IN THE CAMPING WORLD TRUCK SERIES

- Bobby Hamilton (2004) and Ted Musgrave (2005) won the season championship driving a RAM.
- RAM has captured the manufacturer's championship three times in the 17-year history of the series – 2001, 2003 and 2004.
- Tony Raines gave RAM its first win in the series in 1997, winning at I-70 Speedway in Odessa, Mo.
- RAM won 15 of the 24 NCWTS races during the 2001 season, 13 of 25 in 2003 and 11 of 25 in 2004.
- There have been 424 races in the NCWTS beginning at Phoenix International Raceway on Feb. 2, 1995. There were three RAM drivers – Joe Bessey, Bob Keselowski and Walker Evans – in the 33-truck starting field. Bessey scored a fourth-place finish.

#### RAM TALK

"I would call Kentucky more like a mile-and-a-half short track mainly because of the different grooves and the racing the drivers can do running high and low. You think of it more of a short track just because of the close-quarters racing."
